“Wildlife Up Close”

Growing up in Brooklyn led Katherine Hoak to a longing to see wildlife and natural open spaces. Photography provided a means of holding on to those valuable experiences.

Katherine received most of her photographic training at the International Center of Photography in NYC. She has traveled worldwide, and has taken enormous pleasure in seeing wildlife within its own environments. Her trip to the Galapagos Islands particularly offered the unique experiences of observing wildlife up close. The blue-footed boobies and sea lions expressed no fear of the camera or the people behind the lens because they have no natural predators.

Photographing wildlife continued in Alaska and Kenya. A private safari in Tanzania, East Africa, provided the rare opportunity of being able to explore the Ngorongoro Crater and the Serengeti. There she was able to sit as long as she chose with her guide, sometimes for hours, photographing those rare moments that we see in her photos.

Katherine's great skill is in catching fleeting moments while observing wildlife, a necessary talent since animals don't pose! Katherine's way of describing her travel experiences photographing wildlife is just simply... “Amazing!”
